What is the 13 Villages project?

In 2004, Prof. Ibrahim Abouleish, SEKEM's founder had initiated a project to develop the villages surrounding SEKEM Farm. The project was in action for three years, during which the 13 villages received campaigns and actions for their development.

The project included gathering, separating, and recycling waste, building sanitary rooms, raising awareness on health through medical convoys, trainings on Biodynamic agriculture and composting, restorations and maintenance of buildings, illiteracy classes, scholarships and employment for children with special needs, and supporting small projects.

Heliopolis University for Sustainable Development (HUSD) with SEKEM group of companies decided to reinitiate the project in October 2019 with the students, teachers, professors, and SEKEM staff, building on the first project's experience and knowledge of the area and in line with SEKEM Vision 2057, Egypt vision 2030 and SDGs 2015-2030 that covers the four dimensions of sustainable development; ecology, economy, society, and culture.

The project will cover an area of 45,000 kilometers squares with around 35,000 residents in 13 villages: Abu Shair, Ali Kamel Metwally, Galfina 1, 2, 3, Nabih, Karama, Kamal Nakhla, Maher, Tahaweya, Dahar, Basateen Barakat, and new Manshiyya.

Heliopolis University Rural Development Centre (HU-RDC) at HUSD is leading this ongoing initiative in order to support HUSD students, staff, and alumni to face the sustainable development challenges in these villages. It is a step further from academia to the field in order to achieve positive change and development in the community and to the students reciprocally.

HU-RDC is the coordinator entity of this project with the 5 faculties (Pharmacy, Engineering, Business and Economics, Physical Therapy and Organic Agriculture), the Alumni Association, Research Department, SEKEM Schools, and SEKEM Medical Center to achieve the promising goal of the 13 villages community development project.

The project is an opportunity for the 13villages to improve their living conditions and to create job opportunities; but it is also a chance for the students to get involved in community work, to find ways through their fields of studies to serve people and their country.

Health on Wheels / Medical Convoys in the 13 Villages

As part of community service, Heliopolis University Centre for Integrative Health started a new health program in the 13 villages called "Health on Wheels" The program includes workshops, home visits to sick, old and underprivileged people and visits to public schools. It offers examinations to children and adults, as well as prescriptions issued for medical or physiotherapeutic treatment. Additionally, program aims to raising underprivileged awareness of the communities on their medical rights and help them to getting papers issued so they can benefit from the governmental insurance. Health convoys are taking place regularly in the area of the 13 villages.

The academy wants to continuously increase and diversify its sports offer while it is growing in order to give access to sport to more boys and girls from the surrounding villages and to increase the inter-community exchange.

The football team is supposed to be the starting point of creating an official sports club which participates in various sport activities of the governorate of Sharkia and which goes actively into the villages to initiate sport games with children of the schools from the 13 villages.

NextFood incubation program for young entrepreneurs from 13 Villages By Lion Nebelung

During October 2021, 8 young entrepreneurs (4 females, 4 males) joined the first two of three incubation cycles which support the development and growth of start-up in agribusiness and agroindustry. Graduating start-ups will be able to develop their own Minimum Viable Product (MVP), learn how to manage their finances, learn how to market their products as well as reaching customers, and how to develop their sales competencies.

The first cycle has its focus on business topics such as marketing, business modeling, finance, and feasibility studies. In the second cycle the participants developed a prototype of their ideas using the fab lab. The ideas of the 8 young entrepreneurs were in the direction of cattle and chicken breeding and mushroom and organic orange cultivation.
